Generosity

I am consistently impressed with the generosity of the people of Huntington Lake!

Over recent years the department has been able to bring help, comfort and often life saving care to people in need, because of your help. Even during the current financial crisis, members of our community have managed to keep the Fire Department high on their priorities with continued monetary gifts. We are extremely grateful for your continued support both with your help with the pancake breakfast and your financial contributions.

We too have benefitted from the vision and contributions of the HLVFD Board of Directors who have worked hard to help chart our future and reduce the need for funding by preparing grants to pay for major purchases. Most recently we were granted over \$38,000 from FEMA for structural protective clothing, a cost our donors will not have to bear.

We have also been blessed with firefighters who give their time, talent, and often treasure to make our service to others possible. Sadly, this fall, we lost one of those gifted and generous firefighters to cancer.

Bob Leach made a real difference at Huntington. He committed himself from the first day he joined the department to learn as much as he could about medical care, rescues and firefighting so that he could better serve those in need. Bob completed all the training for EMT and firefighter for our department and went on to master the course and in-service work for paramedic, so that he could be even better prepared to bring medical care to our patients. As a board member he worked hard, first on the

Engine 62 replacement project and later on the ambulance project to make a first class medical rescue unit a reality for our community. Firefighter Leach fought many fires and participated in difficult rescues during his tenure. On countless occasions I had the honor of serving at his side ministering to patients who were suffering, as he gave help, hope, and medical care. People are alive today that may not have been without his dedication, training, and generosity. I counted Bob as a close friend, and like many of you miss him very much. The Huntington Lake Fire Department will never be the same without his enthusiasm, humor, dedication, and professionalism.



Scripture says that the ultimate gift is the one given “with no hope of return “. Bob Leach gave that kind of gift-of-self for others. He was proud and pleased that he could be of service as a member of the Huntington Lake Fire Department and from time to time, after a 911 call or a training that went

well, he could be heard to say “*God we’re good!*”

I say to you Bob, *yes we are!*because of people like you, who have given their best, *so that others may live!*
